What a great way to start this year's Arts Education Program by hosting a performance for the children.


"The Story of Nujoud" is a multidisciplinary performance that combines two artistic expressions that are deeply rooted in our origins: storytelling and shadow theatre performance. The project mixes between different disciplines, namely shadow theatre, puppets and storytelling to produce an artistic performance addressed to the whole family.



CHILD PROTECTION PROGRAMS

With our partner **HIMAYA**, Ayadina is working on awareness of children's rights. Two prevention programs, **Listen** and **FPSS** (*Focused Psycho-Social Support*) has been launched with the collaboration of Himaya. **Listen** is a program where children learn about positive communication and percussion instruments are used to create rhythm, while the lyrics written by the children focus on the issue of child protection. Other skills the children will be learning are teamwork and listening. The **FPSS** focuses on topics like child rights, bullying, violence, and abuse through recreational activities.





HIPP ORGANIC BABY FOOD

Himaya has donated 954 Hipp Organic Jars to Ayadina. We gave 100 jars to Mother Theresa's Orphanage. The remaining jars were distributed to the needlest families in the area.

ART EXHIBITION - INTROSPECTION AT 392 RMEIL


